VETERINARY IMPORT PERMIT FOR CATTLE

The Veterinary Authority hereby permits.....

This permit is granted subject to the terms and conditions relating to the importation of the above mentioned set out in the regulations for the time being in force and to the following terms and conditions:-

1. To be accompanied by a health certificate from the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country stating:-

- (a) the country from which the cattle were exported has been free from Foot and Mouth Disease, Contagious Pleuro-pneumonia, Vesicular Stomatitis, Rinderpest and all other prescribed or infectious or contagious diseases affecting cattle, for a period of at least twenty four months immediately prior to the date of the exportation of the cattle; and
- (b) the cattle are physically sound and in good health and free from symptoms of Foot and Mouth Disease, Contagious Pleuro-pneumonia, Vesicular Stomatitis, and Para-tuberculosis (Johne's Disease) and of other prescribed or infectious or contagious diseases; and
- (c) the cattle have been subjected, with negative reactions, to intradermal tuberculin test with internationally approved antigens, during the thirty days immediately prior to the date of exportation of the cattle; and
- (d) the cattle have been subjected with negative reactions, to serum agglutination test, with internationally approved antigens, for Brucellosis, during the thirty (30) days immediately prior to the date of the exportation of the cattle.

2. Inspection on arrival at the port of entry.

**CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF ANIMALS/BIRDS INTO
ST. KITTS & NEVIS**

All animals/birds arriving in St. Kitts/Nevis must be accompanied by an import permit issued by the Veterinary Authority (Chief Veterinary Officer) in the Department of Agriculture, together with a health certificate issued by a licensed Veterinarian of the country from which the animal is being exported.

TRANSPORT: The animal/bird must travel on a direct "flight" to St. Kitts. Any other route must be approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer.

NOTIFICATION: At least twenty four (24) hours notice of arrival on St. Kitts should be given to the Chief Veterinary Officer.

INSPECTION: On arrival in St. Kitts, the animal/birds will be inspected and will be permitted entry only if all the conditions of the import permit have been complied with and the animal is found in good health and free from symptoms of infectious and contagious diseases. Inspection fees will be charged at the airport.
