This permit is granted subject to the terms and conditions relating to the importations of the above mentioned set out in the regulations for the time being in force and to the following terms and conditions:-

1. To be accompanied by a health certificate from the veterinary authority of the exporting country stating that the animal/bird is in good health and free from symptoms of infectious and contagious diseases.
The animal must be tested for or originate from a country free of the following diseases:
Myxomatosis, Tularemia, and Rabbit Hemorrhagic disease.
2. Inspection on arrival at port of entry

**CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF ANIMALS/BIRDS INTO
ST. KITTS & NEVIS**

All animals/birds arriving in St. Kitts/Nevis **must** be accompanied by an import permit issued by the Veterinary Authority (Chief Veterinary Officer) in the Department of Agriculture, together with a health certificate issued by a licensed Veterinarian of the country from which the animal is being exported.

TRANSPORT: The animal/bird must travel on a direct flight to St. Kitts. Any other route must be approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer.

NOTIFICATION: At least twenty four (24) hours notice of arrival on St. Kitts should be given to the Chief Veterinary Officer.

INSPECTION: On arrival in St. Kitts, the animal/birds will be inspected and will be permitted entry only if all the conditions of the import permit have been complied with and the animal is found in good health and free from symptoms of infectious and contagious disease. Inspection fee will be charged at the airport.
